Welcome to the first edition of the Luke Priddis Foundation's (LPF) newsletter **Puzzle Pieces**.

Why puzzle pieces? Jigsaw pieces are the international symbol for Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). These puzzle pieces represent the complexity involved in diagnosing and treating ASD and the mystery surrounding identifying the cause and finding a cure for this developmental disability. The Luke Priddis Foundation is working towards joining some of these pieces for families who are affected by ASD.

As a father of four kids with a demanding job, I know the challenges our household faces on a daily basis. Having a child with ASD can put added pressure on relationships, day to day activities and family time. Just like many other families in a similar position, sometimes it can feel like we are living and breathing ASD in our house. Together we can work towards making a real difference to kids with ASD and their families.



Recently we launched our first ever direct mail donation appeal. If you made a donation we are very grateful and you will be receiving your tax deductible receipt any day. As the co-founder of the Foundation I want to thank you all for your support, and as the father of a son with ASD I thank you on behalf of the hundreds of other families and children who are helped in some way by your support.

2010 promises to be an eventful year. We will be holding a community forum on the 9th of August to help educate parents, families and professionals about ASD, we will be launching our first playgroup for children with ASD, and also commencing MyTime (respite) support groups.

The LPF has been working to form a relationship with the University of Western Sydney (UWS) and we are excited to announce that the LPF offices have moved to the UWS Kingswood campus, located within the special needs precinct of the University (just off Second Street). Indications have been given that University land will be made available for the first LPF Autism Specific Early Intervention Centre of Excellence (ASEICE), providing for a strong future.

Playgroups, MyTime Sessions and Workshops

We have a fantastic announcement! LPF will be establishing Playgroups for kids aged 0 to 6 years with ASD or ASD-like symptoms.

Our Playgroups will be a local first as we will be running the groups on Saturdays.... so everyone (not just the primary carer) can attend. The first Playgroups will be located at St Marys Public School where parents, siblings, grandparents and other family members are welcome to come and play in a relaxed and understanding environment. Once our first Playgroup is up and running, we will be looking to establish further Playgroups in the region. We will select locations based on where these groups are most in demand.

LPF will also be establishing MyTime groups for families of children with ASD and other special needs, to be run on Saturdays following our Playgroup sessions. The MyTime groups will be attended by a facilitator to assist family members as they share stories, information and support with other families and carers in a similar situation while the children are kept active and busy by a play helper.

We are very excited about setting up these new groups as we see this as an important service for the ASD community.

LPF will also be holding ASD workshops and seminars towards the end of the year to help educate parents and professionals who work with children with ASD. To find out more about these sessions, please stay tuned to our website www.lukepriddisfoundation.com.

Funding Opportunities for Kids with ASD

- The government has extended the FaHCSIA funding for children with ASD. Families can now access up to \$12,000 over two years for their child with ASD up until the child reaches the age of seven. www.fahcsia.gov.au
- Children with ASD (and their families) can now access over 35 sessions of treatment per year and receive rebates through Medicare, with no age limit! Go to www.health.gov.au for more information.
- DADHC has money available to families who are participating in a project they fund or co-fund. The money is available upon request to assist with the purchase of equipment to complement the child's Individual Education Plan (IEP). For more info you can contact DADHC in your area. www.dadhc.nsw.gov.au
- Under the 'Helping Children with Autism' package, children under 13 can access four assessment sessions (over their lifetime) and those 15 and under can access 20 treatment sessions (over their lifetime). www.fahcsia.gov.au
